Effective 11 Jul 2011, Senior Non-Commissioned Officer Academy by correspondence (Course 12/14v5) and Senior Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education (SEJMPE) updates were transferred to the San Antonio Total Force Service Center.

If your course 12/14 or SEJPME is not showing in your records, and you completed the course more than 30 days ago, you must e-mail a copy of your course certificate to afgibilltransfer@us.af.mil for update. Certificates are the only acceptable source document.

SNCOA—Course 14 Version 6 Update from AFPC

SNCOA class 14-3/E are the last two classes Course 14V6DL will be learned during the first week of class. It is the prerequisite for the inresidence course. All SMSgt/(S)MSgt/MSgt must complete this DL prior to attending Class 15-A/B/C/D/E and into the future.

There was some talk about Course 14V6 being inactive until Jul 14. This is not true. Course 14V6 is active and must be completed prior to being scheduled for SNCOA starting with class 15-A.

The curriculum updated and members that have not completed Course 14V6 and have not attended SNCOA in-residence during FY14 will need to complete Course 14V6.

The AFI (36-2301) is currently being updated and is in the final stages of coordination. The updated AFI will modify several force development policies. The following information establishes short term enrollment and eligibility requirements concerning application EPME DL courses. The criteria is temporary in nature and will be revised once EPME transformation policy is published.

Course 14: Senior Non-Commissioned Officer Course Version 6:

Rank Requirements:

AD: E7 and above or E6 with valid promotion sequence number

ANG/AFR: E7 and above or E6 with 24 months TIG Educational Prerequisite:

AD: NCO Academy

ANG/AFR: Air Reserve and Air Guard Technicians

must meet military eligibility criteria to enroll; Civil Service pay grade or position is not used to determine eligibility. Air Reserve Component (AFR and ANG) personnel must wait one year after graduation from a DL EPME program to attend the next level of DL EPME.

Course 15: Non-Commissioned Officer Course Version 1

Rank Requirements:

AD: E6 with greater than 2 years TIG that also have 2 or more deferments from NCOA; E6 with less than 1 year TIG; or E6 returned from NCOA to home station prior to graduation as a result of government shutdown

ANG: E7 promoted under EPME AF promotion deferment policy; E6 with 7 skill level; or E5 with 96 months TIS/7 skill level

AFR: E5 with 72 months TIS/7 skill level or E6 with 7 skill level

Educational Prerequisite:

AD: Airman Leadership School (ALS)

ANG/AFR: ALS or acceptable equivalent

Additional Requirements:

ANG/AFR: Air Technicians cannot use Civil Service status to determine eligibility

If you recently returned from deployment and have not scheduled your WAPS test, you are authorized 60 calendar days testing preparation time. The 60-day period includes any leave, special pass, compensatory time off, and/or rest and recuperation taken upon completion of the contingency TDY.
