Job satisfaction depends on matching your career and work environment to your preferred personality traits. During this session we will take a short personality assessment, explore the results, and investigate resources which will help you discover career fields based on your assessment results.

Funding Your Education

This briefing is for you if you are a student using Tuition Assistance and haven't yet explored other funding opportunities to limit out of pocket costs or if you have a dependent going off to college soon.

We will have a special briefer from the TRIO program offering an in-depth briefing on all things educational funding related such as, Federal Financial Aid, Scholarships, and grants. This will be followed by a briefing to help you understand the details of your GI Bill benefits so you can make the most of that benefit.

High School to Higher Education

This course is designed for high school students (and their parents) who are college bound. We begin by offering an assessment to help students match their choice of college major and career goals to personality type in order to achieve greater satisfaction. We then offer information on the college search and application process from cradle to grave. A detailed Financial Aid Briefing exploring FAFSA, scholarships, and grants will be given. At the conclusion of the session, a GI Bill briefing will be offered for those who have transferred VA education benefits to dependents.
